

## IDP Schools 2007/2008

Help Without Frontiers (HWF) is supporting 27 Schools with 3.499 students and 185 teachers in Karen State (Burma) for the school year 2007/2008. In this area the Karen army (KNLA) and the government troops (SPDC) are fighting now over 60 years. That is why the situation of those schools is not stable as they are in constant danger to be attacked by the SPDC. Most of the schools are in areas controlled by the KNLA. They are situated in villages in the jungle so it is very hard to reach them. To get there you have to walk sometimes for days on small paths winding through the mountains because there are no roads. Transportation of supplies to the schools is very difficult and exhausting in the area.

The roads which exist are controlled by the SPDC. To reach some schools one has to cross those roads and put oneself into danger to be arrested by the SPDC. Another danger is that the area is heavily mined. Mines are laid by both sides which means nobody knows exactly where there are mines and which area is safe.

The food variety is very limited as the people can only have what grows on their fields. When the SPDC attacks the villages it is also common that they burn their crops and food supplies before they leave again.

Because the schools are so difficult to reach the support is hard to get there. To be able to support the schools HWF is working together with the Karen Education Department (KED). All of the schools are running under the umbrella of KED which takes care of the schools. KED prepares school materials and stationery and ensure that they get to the schools. They distribute teacher subsidies and other materials to the schools; write reports, proposals and financial reports; collect statistics and information and offer teacher training during the summer holidays. Further they arrange school visits and meetings and manage school ceremonies. KED also takes care of additional needs such as repairing the school building or build a new one.

The main goals of KED are to provide education in those remote areas, to ensure the schools keep running and to keep the children healthy. Further the quality of education should get better through an improvement of teacher qualifications, of the school's management and environment.

The schools are located in the Districts of Mutraw, Doo Pla Ya (including Special Area which is under the control of SPDC, DKBA and KNLA) and Pa-An. The primary schools are offering Karen, Burmese, English, Math's, Science, and Geography as subjects. In middle school History is added and high school adds health hygiene. They teach either only the KED curriculum or a combination of the Burmese and the KED curriculum.

The students are Karen although there are some other ethnic groups attending the schools along the border to Thailand. Most of the students Parents are farmers or work in their communities.
